## **Passenger Traffic At Singapore Changi Airport Continues To Rise In February**

Stronger demand for air travel during the Lunar New Year season last month pushed Singapore Changi Airport's passenger traffic up 6.2 per cent compared to a year ago, to 2.31 million. The highest traffic volume for the month was recorded on 13 February, when Changi Airport served some 102,000 travellers. For the first two months of 2005, Changi Airport's passenger traffic rose 3.2 per cent to 4.84 million.

In terms of cargo, Changi Airport moved about 127,490 tonnes of cargo last month, 6.5 per cent less than in February 2004, due to the traditional slowdown in airfreight traffic during the Lunar New Year holiday period. For the first two months of 2005, Changi Airport handled some 269,150 tonnes of airfreight, or 3.4 per cent higher than a year ago.

Changi Airport is currently served by over 75 airlines that operate more than 3,700 weekly flights to about 170 cities in the world.
