CAAS Opens Terminal 3 to Public for a Sneak Preview

T3 Open House offers the public a chance to visit the terminal before it opens for flight operations next year

The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) is inviting members of the public to tour Changi Airport's brand new terminal, Terminal 3 (T3), before it opens for flight operations next year. CAAS is organising an Open House, from 12 November to 9 December 2007, during which all visitors are welcome to tour the terminal.

The Open House will feature a Visitor Galley with various display panels featuring T3's highlights, as well as other information or plasma TV displays at various locations in the terminal. A range of T3 souvenirs, such as limited edition T3 Swatch watches, will be on sale during the Open House.

Mr Lim Kim Choon, Director-General and Chief Executive Officer, CAAS, said, "Through the Open House, we hope to give members of the public an opportunity to get a first-hand view of the landmark terminal before it opens for flight operations. We welcome everyone to join in the excitement of seeing Terminal 3 come into being and becoming a significant milestone in Singapore's civil aviation development." Mr Lim added, "After all, the last time Singapore celebrated the opening of a new airport terminal was more than 15 years ago when Terminal 2 started operations in 1990."

During the Open House, the public can visit T3 anytime from 10am to 5pm on weekdays and, 9am to 6pm on Saturdays and Sundays. A T3 Open House guide brochure (available in English, Chinese, Malay and Tamil) will be available to assist visitors in exploring the new terminal on their own.

Visiting the public areas of T3 will be free of charge. Those interested in visiting the transit (restricted) areas may purchase an admission ticket at T3's departure check-in hall. The tickets will cost S\$1 for a self-guided tour or S\$3 for a guided tour lasting about 45 minutes. Admission into the transit areas is free for children aged 3 years old and below. All proceeds from the sale of admission tickets will be donated to the Singapore Cancer Society, a charitable organisation adopted by CAAS.
